Materials

- Embroidery hoop (6-inch or 8-inch)
- Embroidery fabric (linen, Aida cloth, or evenweave)
- Embroidery floss in the following colors:
 - Yellow
 - Green
 - Red
 - White
 - Black

- Embroidery needle
- Scissors
- Optional: Pencil or fabric marker

Instructions

Step 1: Transfer the pattern to the fabric. If you are using a pencil or fabric marker, lightly trace the pattern onto the fabric. If you are using a water-soluble pen, trace the pattern onto a piece of water-soluble paper and then place the paper on the fabric. Wet the paper and press it down so that the pattern transfers to the fabric.

Step 2: Thread the needle and start stitching. Thread the needle with two strands of yellow floss. Start stitching at the bottom of the fairy's dress. Use a backstitch to stitch the outline of the dress.

Step 3: Stitch the bodice of the dress. Use a satin stitch to stitch the bodice of the dress. Start at the top of the bodice and stitch down to the waist. Repeat this process for the other side of the bodice.

Step 4: Stitch the wings. Use a backstitch to stitch the outline of the wings. Then, use a satin stitch to fill in the wings.

Step 5: Stitch the hair and face. Use a satin stitch to stitch the hair. Start at the top of the head and stitch down to the shoulders. Use a backstitch to stitch the eyes and mouth.

Step 6: Stitch the snowflakes. Use a backstitch to stitch the snowflakes. Start at the center of the snowflake and stitch out to the points.

Step 7: Finish the embroidery. Once you have finished stitching the design, knot the thread and trim the excess. Then, remove the fabric from the hoop and press it.

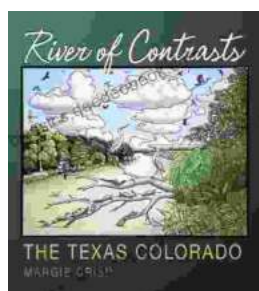
