- Chain 3 (counts as a double crochet).
- Double crochet into the same stitch as the chain 3.
- Chain 2, turn, and double crochet into the next stitch.
- Chain 2 and skip the next stitch. Double crochet into the following stitch.
- Repeat the previous step until you reach the end of the row.

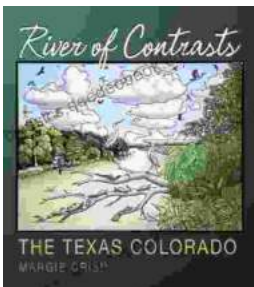
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
