

How to Crochet Dream Catchers: A Step-by-Step Guide for Beginners

Materials

- Yarn: You can use any type of yarn for your dream catcher, but a medium-weight yarn will work best. Some popular choices include cotton, acrylic, and wool.

- Crochet hook: The size of your crochet hook will depend on the thickness of your yarn. For a medium-weight yarn, a size H (5mm) hook is a good choice.
- Scissors
- Yarn needle
- Embroidery floss or other decorative thread (optional)
- Beads or other embellishments (optional)

Instructions

1. Make a slip knot

To start crocheting, you'll need to make a slip knot. To do this, make a loop with your yarn and slip it onto your crochet hook. Then, pull the working yarn through the loop to tighten it.

2. Chain 4

Once you have made a slip knot, chain 4. This will create the base of your dream catcher.

3. Single crochet in the 4th chain from the hook

To single crochet, insert your hook into the 4th chain from the hook and yarn over. Then, pull the yarn through the chain and yarn over again. Pull the yarn through both loops on your hook to complete the single crochet stitch.

4. Repeat steps 3 and 4 around the chain

Repeat steps 3 and 4 around the chain to create a circle. You should have 12 single crochet stitches in total.

5. Join the circle with a slip stitch

Once you have crocheted around the chain, join the circle with a slip stitch. To do this, insert your hook into the first single crochet stitch you made and yarn over. Then, pull the yarn through the stitch and yarn over again. Pull the yarn through both loops on your hook to complete the slip stitch.

6. Chain 3

Chain 3 to create the first loop of your dream catcher.

7. Double crochet in the next single crochet stitch

To double crochet, yarn over your hook and insert it into the next single crochet stitch. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the stitch. You should now have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the first 2 loops on your hook. Then, yarn over again and pull the yarn through the remaining 2 loops on your hook to complete the double crochet stitch.

8. Repeat steps 7 and 8 around the circle

Repeat steps 7 and 8 around the circle to create 12 loops. Each loop will be made up of 3 double crochet stitches.

9. Join the circle with a slip stitch

Once you have crocheted around the circle, join the circle with a slip stitch. To do this, insert your hook into the first double crochet stitch you made and yarn over. Then, pull the yarn through the stitch and yarn over again. Pull the yarn through both loops on your hook to complete the slip stitch.

10. Chain 3

Chain 3 to create the first loop of the next row.

11. Treble crochet in the next loop

To treble crochet, yarn over your hook twice and insert it into the next loop. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the loop. You should now have 4 loops on your hook. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the first 2 loops on your hook. Then, yarn over again and pull the yarn through the next 2 loops on your hook. Finally, yarn over again and pull the yarn through the remaining 2 loops on your hook to complete the treble crochet stitch.

12. Repeat steps 11 and 12 around the circle

Repeat steps 11 and 12 around the circle to create 12 loops. Each loop will be made up of 3 treble crochet stitches.

13. Join the circle with a slip stitch

Once you have crocheted around the circle, join the circle with a slip stitch. To do this, insert your hook into the first treble crochet stitch you made and yarn over. Then, pull the yarn through the stitch and yarn over again. Pull the yarn through both loops on your hook to complete the slip stitch.

14. Chain 3

Chain 3 to create the first loop of the next row.

15. Double crochet in the next loop

To double crochet, yarn over your hook and insert it into the next loop. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the loop. You should now have 3 loops on your hook. Yarn over again and pull the yarn through the first 2 loops on your hook. Then, yarn over again and pull the yarn through the remaining 2 loops on your hook to complete the double

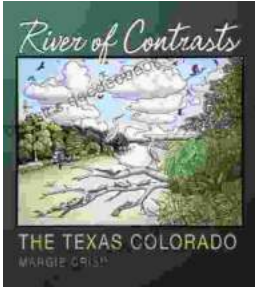


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
