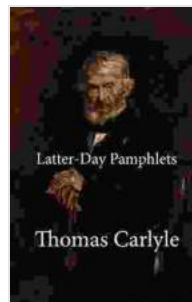


The Neoreactionary Library: Eight Pamphlets with Original Summaries

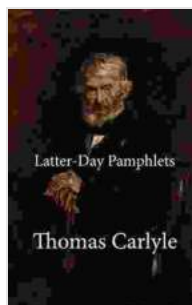
