

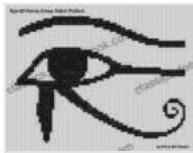

Materials

- 14-count Aida cloth (white or beige)
- DMC embroidery floss in black, white, blue, yellow, and red
- Embroidery needle
- Scissors
- Embroidery hoop (optional)

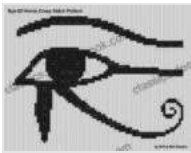
Instructions

1. Thread your needle with black floss and start stitching at the center of the Aida cloth. Count 10 squares down and 10 squares across to find the starting point.
2. Make a cross stitch by bringing the needle up from the back, down through the fabric 2 squares to the right, back up through the fabric 2 squares to the left, and down through the fabric 2 squares above the original hole.
3. Repeat step 2 to complete the first row of black squares.
4. Change to white floss and stitch 1 row above the black row. Repeat this step to create a white border around the black squares.
5. Change to blue floss and stitch a row of half cross stitches above the white border. To make a half cross stitch, only bring the needle up through the fabric (do not bring it back down).
6. Change to yellow floss and stitch a row of full cross stitches above the blue half cross stitches.
7. Change to red floss and stitch a row of half cross stitches above the yellow full cross stitches.
8. Repeat steps 4-7 to complete the other sections of the Eye of Horus design.
9. Once you have completed all the cross stitches, tie off the floss and trim any excess.
10. Frame your finished Eye of Horus cross stitch and display it proudly in your home.

Tips

- Use a sharp needle to avoid snagging the fabric.
- Keep your stitches even and taut, but not too tight.
- If you make a mistake, don't panic. Simply remove the stitches and start over.
- Experiment with different colors of floss to create your own unique Eye of Horus design.
- Add beads or sequins to your cross stitch for a touch of sparkle.

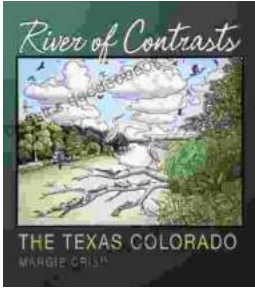
